

In Social Science we continued our study of change makers in history. This week we compared and contrasted Amelia Earhart and Jane Goodall.

In Reading, we read nonfiction books about notable people such as Malala Yousafzai and Eliza Scidmore. Students practiced identifying the author's purpose and answering questions about the text.

In Writing, we completed our opinion writing assessment, choosing if we prefer to spend time inside or outside during the winter.

In Math, we continued to practice measuring objects in inches and centimeters. Students measured paths and determined which paths were longer.
