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# Skip Counting Practice Ideas for Home

Skip count by 5's up to 120

\*Up for a challenge? Skip count backwards! (100..95...90...)

Skip count by 10s starting at any number. (ex. 33, 43, 53, 63...)

Skip count by 100s starting at any number (ex. 256, 356, 456...)

Give your child a number. Ask your child to share the number that comes before when skip counting by:

- 5s: (ex. \_\_\_\_\_, 45) A: 40
- 10s (ex. \_\_\_\_\_, 86) A: 76
- 100s (ex. \_\_\_\_\_, 509) A: 409
